

Award-winning Author Summons Magic in Print



Author JP McLean conjures up witches and warlocks with an abundance of magic in her upcoming release, *The Never Witch*.

Like her previous urban fantasy novels, *The Never Witch* is set in the Pacific Northwest. This latest release is the first in what will become the Thorne Witch series. It tells the story of Adeline Thorne, who was a witch in name only. She never inherited the magic that should have been her birthright. But she's learned to accept it. She's built a quiet life on the west coast as a

talented portrait painter, a big sister, loving aunt, and ex-wife. And that was enough. It had to be.

Until a convicted warlock, in an act of desperation, dumps his magic into her. To him, she was only a vessel. He didn't care that warlock magic was incompatible with her witch's DNA. He didn't care that his attack would jeopardize the fragile peace between witches and warlocks. And he didn't care that his power would tear Adeline's world apart.


The Never Witch now had magic, an irresistible drug. The only problem? The warlock wants it back.

The Never Witch is McLean's eleventh novel. Her first seven-book series, opening with *Secret Sky*, features a woman who discovers she can fly; and the second three-book series, beginning with *Blood Mark*, is about a woman who carries magical and mysterious birthmarks.

This prolific author clearly has a vivid imagination. When asked why she chose to write about witches, McLean said she enjoys creating new twists on old magical tropes. "There are endless possibilities when it comes to magic. It's pure escapism."

McLean is an Eric Hoffer Award winner, a B.R.A.G. medallion honouree, and a three-time Literary Titan award winner. She was a finalist in the Wishing Shelf Book Awards, the Chanticleer International Book Awards, and the Independent Author Network Awards.
